It is with great pleasure that Yonsei honors the following four high achieving, involved, talented and promising high school graduates.

Frank Kiyomura Founder's Scholarship: Isabella Chan

The Frank Kiyomura Founder's Scholarship recipient is Isabella "Izzie" Chan. Izzie graduated from Flintridge Preparatory School in La Cañada Flintridge with a weighted GPA of 3.84 and an unweighted GPA of 3.62. Izzie has been recognized for her achievements with honors such as the Greenwalt Scholarship, Bruins Scholarship and year-round Dean's list and Honor roll at Flintridge Preparatory School. Izzie has also been deeply involved in various community service projects, such as the "Spreading Light to Malawi" initiative, where she sent study kits with inflatable solar lanterns to young women in Malawi to aid in their education and well being. Additionally, she volunteered as a basketball coach for Practice Makes Perfect Basketball Camp and various youth basketball teams, demonstrating her commitment to empowering others through sports. Izzie was captain two years for the prestigious Flintridge Girls Varsity basketball team who were league champions and CIF appearances all four of her years, and includes a CIF championship and several state appearances.
